HISTORY

In 2004, Jose Ramos, a Vietnam Medic, rode his bicycle from Whittier, CA to Washington, DC to campaign for a "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day". After a long journey and sending 10,000 postcards to Congress and President Bush asking to declare March 30th as the official "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day" his efforts finally came to life in 2007. On March 30, 2008, California had its first celebration, which was a huge success, drawing over 4,000 Veterans and family members. On March 29, 2009 California repeated the celebration with another huge success. By 2011, nearly 7,000 people attended the Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day and our hope is to reach many more through the continuation of this effort and give the Veterans of the Vietnam era the welcome home that they deserved but did not get.

Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day is currently scheduled to take place on Saturday, May 18, 2013 after a month long on-air celebration of the achievements of local Southern California Vietnam era Veterans.
